Hill Slough West Restoration Project, Phase I - Preliminary Restoration Design, Environmental Documentation and Permitting

The purpose of the overall project is to restore brackish tidal marsh and associated upland ecotone at the northern Suisun Marsh near the corner of Highway 12 and Grizzly Island Road to benefit endangered as well as migratory and resident species. The funding under this Grant will support Phase 1 of this three-phase project. // This project will meet CALFED Ecosystem Restoration Program (ERP) goals and objectives by reducing the risk of entrainment of at-risk, native anadromous species of concern including spring-run and winter-run Chinook salmon, steelhead trout, and green sturgeon, as well as other resident and transitory fish species in the Suisun Bay. The project will also meet goals calling for restoration of tidal brackish marsh that will aid in the recovery of listed plant and wildlife species while contributing to primary productivity in the estuary.
