Dutch Slough Tidal Marsh Restoration - Phase 1 and 2 (Emerson and Gilbert Parcel)

The Project will restore natural Delta habitats to an 1187-acre site in the western Delta city of Oakley. The site consists of three leveed parcels which will be restored to a mosaic of tidal marsh, riparian woodland, open water, managed marsh, and upland habitats. Construction will consist of earthmoving to create the proper elevations for gradually sloping marsh plain, and other project features such as channel berms, and the rehabilitation of existing levees and construction of new flood control levees. The Project is being implemented by DWR's Delta Levee Program as part of its legislative mandate of 'net habitat improvement' in the Delta. In addition to habitat restoration, the Project will provide recreation and educational opportunities to benefit residents of the Delta, and adaptive management components to inform future Delta restorations.
