100 percent of proposed actions that include habitat restoration in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta meet one of the following standards: (1) are consistent with the text of Appendix 3 (see Appendix B of the Delta Plan), based on the Conservation Strategy for Restoration of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Ecological Management Zone and the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valley Regions; or (2) are not consistent with the elevation map (see Figure 4-6 of the Delta Plan), but the deviation is supported by a rationale based on best available science.

Protect Opportunities to Restore Habitat

100 percent of all proposed actions other than habitat restoration have clearly demonstrated that significant adverse impacts to the opportunity for habitat restoration as described in ER P2 were avoided or mitigated.
